TO THE 25TH ANNUAL A. L. SLONAKER HALL OF FAME & 97TH ANNIVERSARY AWARDS BANQUET

When the local Delta Phi Fraternity affiliated with Kappa Sigma in 1915 as the Gamma-Rho Chapter, its members established a tradition of excellence and brotherhood which has been cherished and nurtured by each succeeding generation of members.

As of today, approximately 1,700 men have been initiated into the Brotherhood. There are now approximately 1,200 living Gamma-Rho alumni who, with few exceptions, were members of an active chapter that was the clear leader on the University of Arizona campus. Year after year, as individuals and as a group, the men of Gamma-Rho have distinguished themselves with high academic standards, excellence in athletics, and campus leadership.

The dimension of brotherhood has always been the chapter's greatest strength. Many close ties which began in the chapter have flourished for entire lifetimes. Large numbers of alumni are residents of the same communities, while others still sharing the bond live across the country from each other. The common interests of Gamma-Rho brothers have changed in many cases but the beginnings of friendship always go back to their association in the fraternity.

While this year marks our 97th year on the Arizona campus, it also is the 25th Annual Hall of Fame Awards Banquet. Conceived as a way of honoring alumni for outstanding achievements, this award has become an integral part of the tradition at Gamma-Rho. Inductees are among a select group of alumni. Recognition is given to those who have excelled in their career, in their service to the community, and/or to the fraternity. In conjunction with the A. L. Slonaker Hall of Fame inductees Gamma-Rho also honors an alumnus as the Mike Cagalj Man of the Year and recognizes several other alumni and undergraduates for awards.

Mike Rogers '60

Brother Mike Rogers is living the life.

As an undergraduate pursuing a degree in Mechanical Engineering, Mike still found time to be an active member of Gamma-Rho. He served the chapter as both Social Chair and Grand Scribe, and was all over the place representing the Scarlet, White & Green on the field, on the court, and in the pool. Rogers competed on our football, softball, swimming, and cross country intramural teams, and was also a member of our champion volleyball squad.

After receiving his degree in 1965, he embarked on a long career in the engineering field, including time with E.I.DuPont - Plant and process engineer, Paul Munroe Hydraulics - Application Engineer, Division Manager, General Hydraulics - Sales Manager, Greer Accumulators - Application Engineering Manager

Haskel Controls – President, McFadden Flight Simulators- VP Sales and Marketing and Hydraulic Controls - Engineering and Sales Manager.

His work has gone into the realm of entertainment, as he's helped with both the "Cars" and "Toy Story" rides at California Adventure, as well as the "Fantasmic Dragon" at Disneyland. He has Special Effect Film Credits for "Master And Commander," "Spiderman," "Live Free Or Die Hard," "Perfect Storm," and "Flubber."

Recent projects also include a 60,000lb. steel coil loader system for California Steel and a one million pound, 80' diameter turntable at Edwards Air Force Base used for precise position control to test electronic warfare aircraft systems. Now he splits time as a self-employed Consulting Engineer and hitting the slopes as a Ski Instructor at Mammoth.

Mike and Margaret have two daughters, Laura Thompson and Susan Krambeer, and six grandchildren: Sam, 7, Josh, 6, and Mack, 4, with Laura and her husband, Kevin, and Tyler, 11, Jessica, 9, and Jillian, 2, with Susan and her husband, John.

Brother Rogers recalls, "The education I received at Gamma Roe has turned out to be one the most important learning experience of my life. Whatever success I have enjoyed in my life as a husband, parent and in business has, is part, based in the teachings and character building I received From Kappa Sigma.

"I also made friends for life at 1325 E. Speedway. After some 50 years most of my closest friends are Brothers."

Terry Leonard '94 (special initiate)

Terry Leonard staunchly believes, “if you hang on long enough during a tragedy, it will open options down the road.” He should know, as an injury that derailed his athletic career helped propel him into a career as a Lifetime Achievement Award winning professional Stuntman.

Leonard was running track and playing football at the University of Wisconsin Milwaukee, and was planning on trying out for US Olympic Team in the decathlon. Wanting to face greater challenges to help prepare him, he called his childhood friend from Wisconsin, Sam Antcliffe '61, discussed options, and decided to transfer.

Terry hopped in his '54 Oldsmobile convertible, drove to the Old Pueblo, and arrived one rainy night, woke Sam at his home, then promptly slept on his couch. Sam introduced him to Foggy Smith and some of the Kappa Sigmas. He became a social member and repped the fraternity in some intramural track events, demolishing other fraternities in the process.

After a conversation with Track Coach Carl Cooper '40, Leonard was in and ran track for Arizona for a year.

Brother Leonard competed in the Olympic Trials for the Tokyo Games, 1964. “I was never good enough to make it, but am proud I was good enough to compete.” An ankle sprain helped cut his plans short, and also caused him to be dropped from a spot at L.A. Rams rookie camp that was to take place shortly after the Olympic trials.

Leonard played in the Continental Football League, and was playing for the BC Lions in Canada before an injury resulted in his release and the end of his career.

Staring at the walls and not sure what to do, he decided to call John Wayne's double, whom he had met working as an extra on the movie “McClintock” while in college. After listening to what it was all about, he moved to California “and caught fire.”

A quick check at IMDB.com shows 125 titles spanning the last 50 years in which he performed or coordinated stunts. He's appeared in four movies with John Wayne, “El Dorado,” “Rio Lobo,” “Big Jake,” “The Train Robbers.” He's doubled for Harrison Ford in “Raiders of the Lost Ark” and “Cowboys and Aliens.” Other credits include “Blazing Saddles,” “Apocalypse Now,” “Blues Brothers,” “48 Hours” and “Rush Hour.”

Some of his career highlights and awards include the highest fall in the world before the airbag was invented. Was 1967, “Run Shadow Run,” unheralded film out of 20th Century Fox, winning “Most Spectacular Stunt” award for “Romancing the Stone,” A Golden Boot and a Lifetime Achievement Award in 2003. He is also particularly proud of a stunt in “Raiders of the Lost Ark” in which he jumped off a horse on to a moving track, and ends up getting dragged behind the truck by his whip. “Stuntmen are happy to remain unknown and not get the attention, but that one took on a life of its own and Harrison was a little jealous of the attention I got for that one.”

Realizing again how injuries (he’s had more than you can count on your fingers) might affect his career, Terry took over opportunity to further learn the craft and now, in addition to performing and coordinating stunts, also does Second Unit (action sequence) Direction.

Terry was officially initiated into Kappa Sigma while in Tucson filming “Tombstone” in 1994.

Sons Matt and Malosi Leonard are already following in their father’s Golden Boot footsteps, each with more than 50 titles under their belts, including “NCIS:LA” and “Sons Of Anarchy.”

Brother Leonard is also a member of the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association and is a Team Roper. He enjoys his time riding.



Greg Mammana '90

A Gamma-Rho initiate ('90), Greg graduated from the University of Arizona in 1992 with a BA in Political Science, and from the University of Phoenix with a MA in Organizational Management. As an undergraduate, Brothers Scott Gimple '90 and Jay Freedman '90 recall Mammana "was Jersey Shore two decades before there was a Jersey Shore" and that he had a propensity to tell the "corniest jokes, only ones he thought were funny. He was always the sober one, which is probably why we can't remember any ridiculous stories about him." He was always generous, having brothers to his parents' house in the foothills and taking them golfing at Tucson National.

Brother Mammana, along with Brother Gimple, played Forward on the University of Arizona Men's Soccer Team from 1988-1991.

In 1994 Brother Mammana became Officer Mammana, starting with the Casa Grande Police Department. In 1998 he made the lateral move to serve with the Tucson Police Department. Greg received a Medal of Valor on January 24, 2001 for his efforts. While serving and protecting, Mammana also continued with the learning, earning a Master's Degree in 2003, and educating, teaching at the University of Phoenix. He is currently a Lieutenant in the TPD Homeland Security Department.

He married Kristen in October of 2000, and his son Nicholas was born August the following year. "Nicholas is Greg's pride and joy. They are so alike it's ridiculous," says Kristen.

Greg was somehow Jedi Mind-Tricked by Matt Noble '84 and the Housing Corporation to serve as the Alumnus Advisor to the new Gamma-Rho Colony, a challenging role, time consuming, and ultimately rewarding role, to say the least. Matt says: "I reviewed the list of alumni living in Tucson and reached out to the guy I thought had the skills & passion to make a difference, and one that could manage a large group of assistant advisors. Greg was the best choice and he never wavered when I asked."

Grand Master Nick Maccarone had this to say about Brother Mammana's involvement, "Greg has been instrumental in our success so far. As a direct advisor to me, as well as the colony, Greg has provided guidance, as well as support to every member he can. He has dedicated his time and hard work to ensure that we are successful. As President, I personally, as well as the colony, would like to thank him for everything he has done and will continue to do."
