

Jerry Cessor '57

Brother Cessor has sculpted a career characterized by leadership and loyalty, two traits that he found in the brotherhood of Gamma-Rho. After graduating with a Bachelor of Science in Mechanical Engineering, he went out into the workforce as a Sales Engineer at the Trong Company. After four years, he moved on to Lang & Associates in Denver, where he quickly progressed to Vice President. In 1975, Brother Cessor founded Climatec Inc., a heating, ventilation, and airconditioning (HVAC) manufacturing firm. Serving as President until he retired in 1987, he molded Climatec Inc. into one of the most prominent HVAC companies in the state. During the 1980's, Climatec was voted one of the 100 Best Companies in Arizona by Arizona Business Magazine.

Now that he is retired, Brother Cessor has plenty of time to relax with his wife Marsha and daughters Kate, Suzy and Anne. After retiring – on his 50th birthday, no less – he and Marsha spent three years sailing from San Diego, through the Panama Canal, and into the Caribbean Sea. He also serves as a Board Member of Cottonwood Country Club and is a member of the Marathon Yacht Club.

As an undergrad at Gamma-Rho, Brother Cessor participated in a number of activities, including intramural volleyball and flag football. But his most important accolades stem from his focus on academics. Not only was he on the Dean's list for the majority his time as an undergrad, he also won the Industrial Press Award for academic achievement in HVAC studies.

Whether he was carrying a football into the end zone or helping fellow brothers improve their academic standings, Brother Cessor was a very important part of the Gamma-Rho Chapter as an undergrad. Now as an alumnus, he has continued his loyalty by contributing to the Gamma-Rho Alumni Chapter, Educational Foundation, and Housing Corporation. His efforts have not only made it possible for others to share in the Kappa Sigma family, but have also raised the bar for achievement in the professional world.

Russell Carter Jr. '61

When Brother Carter reflects on his experience at the University of Arizona, he believes that he spent the best years of his college career with a group of men who shared a similar dedication and love for the close-knit family atmosphere found in the Gamma-Rho chapter. Despite leaving the UA to complete his Bachelor of Science Degree at San Diego State University, Brother Carter attributes many of the qualities that define him as a professional and family man back to Kappa Sigma and the chapter. As a member of Gamma-Rho, Brother Carter led by example, helping to establish in others the lessons that he learned as an active. He says that his only regret was not completing his degree at the UA.

But luckily for himself, his family, and especially the chapter, Brother Carter may have left the chapter physically, but his legacy and devotion live on. Both his brother, Richard Carter '65, and son Rusty Carter '94 were initiated into the fraternity, helping to reclaim his stake in the chapter despite residing miles away. After Rusty pledged Gamma-Rho, Brother Carter reconnected with the chapter by serving on the House Corporation. During his time on the Board, he helped lead the charge to rebuild the Chapter House and resurrect strong alumni communication. Just as he did as an active, Brother Carter led by example, effectively changing the climate of the Kappa Sigma fraternity life for years to come.

After graduating in 1966, Brother Carter began working as a claim specialist for State Farm Insurance Companies. After 13 years, he established the Russ Carter Insurance Agency in 1979 in El Cajon, CA. His career success has been marked with numerous distinctions and honors, including earning Legion of Honor status, and the designation as two-time Millionaire Club Qualifier.

Brother Carter has also been a stellar member of the El Cajon community. He is a past board member of the Foothills United Methodist Church and coached both girls and boys youth soccer and baseball. A consummate family man, Brother Carter is a dedicated father and husband. Despite all the time spent helping others, his primary commitment has been to his family, which speaks volumes about his character and focus in life.

To sum up his past and current experience at Gamma-Rho, Brother Carter said. "My reconnection with Gamma-Rho, when my son pledged in 1993, only confirmed my fond memories. Nothing had changed, just some new faces."

Quentin Rench '63

To say that the Gamma-Rho Chapter was important to Brother Quin Rench would be a gross understatement. In his words, "Kappa Sigma was the University to me." That statement says a lot considering his accomplishments in both his professional career and in his family life.

After graduating with a Bachelor of Science in Business
Administration in 1970, Brother Rench embarked on successful career with the Von Schrader Company, an upholstery and carpet-cleaning product manufacturer that is known world-wide as a leader in its field. After progressing up the corporate ladder, Brother Rench was named president of the company in 1986. Through his hard work and leadership, the company has enjoyed continued success while revolutionizing the industry.

Brother Rench's professional success does not stop there, however. He is also CEO and Chairman of Racine Industries/HOST, an international company that develops and tests new cleaning equipment and products for commercial and home use. Racine Industries/HOST is one of the most recognizable names in the industry and has recently developed a world-wide educational program designed to educate people about the company's products and how to use them properly.

Brother Rench has also established himself as an important member of the Racine community. He has volunteered countless hours as Director of the Racine Council on Alcohol and Drug Abuse while playing a large role in the Racine aviation community. He has founded the Racine Chapter of Experimental Aircraft Association, the Southwest Wisconsin Aviation Museum, and the Southwest Wisconsin Aviation Hall of Fame. Additionally, he helped put Racine on the map in the world of tennis by founding Racine World Team Tennis.

The effect that Gamma-Rho has on its members is very clear in regards to Brother Rench. From his days as Social Chairman to his work as an alumnus, Brother Rench has not strayed far from the family atmosphere provided by the chapter. He remains an active individual who has provided a shining example for others in the chapter. Brother Rench is happily married to wife Barbie and is the proud father of two children, Kevin and Debbie.
